Did you Know...

Most employers now search job candidates' social media profiles, and more than half report rescinding at least one job offer because of what a candidate posted.

Those pictures from that epic party may come back to haunt you.

Alcohol convictions might include:

- Minor in possession
- Disorderly conduct
- Driving under the influence (A blood alcohol concentration of 0.02 can earn a DUI charge for a minor.)
- Use of a false ID or misrepresenting your age to buy alcohol
- Purchasing or providing alcohol to minors

WHAT'S YOUR DEGREE WORTH?

An alcohol-related conviction may make it worth less than you think!

Don't put it at risk!

What do you need to know?

Position	Education Requirements	Licensing Authority	Important Information
Police Officer	High school diploma or Bachelor's Degree	State of Nebraska	Must disclose all convictions; alcohol conviction in the last two years may prevent hire; felonies preclude hire
Military Service	High school diploma or GED	N/A	Must disclose all convictions; some convictions, especially recent ones, will prevent enlistment or security clearance
Government Agent	Bachelor's Degree in applicable field	N/A	Must disclose all convictions; some convictions, especially recent ones, will prevent security clearance or thus employment
Counselor	Master's degree in Counseling or related field, supervised clinical experience, state exam	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Psychologist	Doctoral Degree in Psychology, dissertation, internship or other clinical experience	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure
Social Worker	Bachelor's Degree; Master's Degree; clinical or field experience	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Teacher	Bachelor's Degree	State of Nebraska, Department of Education	Must disclose all convictions; the Board may refuse to issue or re-issue a license based on past or recent convictions
Chiropractor	3-4 years of undergraduate education plus 4 year Doctor of Chiropractic program; clinical experience; state exams	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure
Dentist	Undergraduate education plus 4 years of education in an accredited dental program, clinical experience, written and practical exams	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Criminal background check required; Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Nurse	2-4 years of undergraduate education, clinical experience, written and practical exams	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Criminal background check required; Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Pharmacist	Doctoral Degree in Pharmacy or professional degree, state exams	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Criminal background check required; Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Physical Therapist	Doctoral Degree in Physical Therapy, clinical experience, written and practical exams	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Criminal background check required; Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Physician	Doctor of Medicine or Osteopathy; extensive clinical experience; written and practical exams	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Criminal background check required; Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Speech and Language Pathologist	Master's Degree in Speech Lanaguage Pathology	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Criminal background check required; Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Veternarian	Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree; clinical experience; written and practical exams	State of Nebraska, Department of Health and Human Services	Criminal background check required; Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Accountant	Bachelor's Degree in accounting or related field; state exams	State of Nebraska Board of Accountancy	Must disclose all convictions; convictions involving fraud will result in denial of certification; other convictions result in denial at Board's discretion
Lawyer/Attorney	Bachelor's Degree plus 3 years of law school; state Bar Association exam	State of Nebraska Bar Association	Criminal background check required; Must disclose all convictions; alcohol or drug convictions require proof of treatment; felonies preclude licensure; state may decline to issue license for other convictions
Professional Engineer	Bachelor's Degree in engineering; supervised professional experience; state exams	State of Nebraska Board of Engineers and Architects	Criminal record for past 10 years must be disclosed; character references required; denial of certification possible based on record
Architect	Bachelor's or Master's degree from an accredited program; internship; state exams	State of Nebraska Board of Engineers and Architects	Criminal record for past 10 years must be disclosed; character references required; denial of certification possible based on record
